REPORT

OF THE

Commissioners of Sullivan County.

In former years the report of the Commissioners of Sullivan County, has been made to Sept. 1 each year, but in conformity to the law of 1878, requiring the report of County Officers to be made annually in the month of May, up to May 1, the Commissioners submit the following report, showing the receipts and disbursements of the Superintendent of the County Farm, from April 1, 1877, to May 1, 1879; an inventory of the property at the farm May 1, 1879; a list of the paupers supported at the farm, the number of weeks each one was supported, a statement of the average cost per week of each, and a list of deaths occurring there from Sept. 1, 1877, to May 1, 1879.

The report also shows the amount paid for aid and support of County paupers away from the farm, during the 20 months from September 1, 1877 to May 1, 1879.

During the period embraced in this report, twenty have died, many of the number having lived to extreme age; thirteen were each more than 75 years old, while the average age of the whole number is 74 1-10 years. Betty Carr, of whom mention has been made in former reports had lived to be 110 years.

No outlay for enlargement or alterations upon the buildings at the farm, as was contemplated in the last Commissioners' report, has been made.

The last County Convention authorized the Commissioners to purchase a wood lot, for the purpose of furnishing a supply of fuel for the Alms House. Acting under this authority and the necessity of the case, a lot conveniently located, was bought in the Fall of 1878, at a cost of \$ 450.
